Greetings and warmest welcome to Kootenai Kangals. Thank you for your interest in this amazing breed. We would like to start off by sharing some basic facts about Livestock Guardian Dogs and the Kangal.

Your puppy could live for up to 18 years. It will take three years of high-quality food and continuous growth for them to reach an adult weight of between 100-160 pounds and stand approximately 28-34 inches tall at the shoulder.

This breed is purpose-built to be outside working and guarding your livestock. They are not pets and will not do well being placed in such a role. One of their first lines of defense is a series of loud barks. Please be aware that this may be bothersome to you and your neighbors.

To ensure the continued health of your pup s/he will need your guidance, patience, love and training as well as regular vaccinations and veterinary care, clean water, and a minimum of one fenced, secured acre per dog in which to run and exercise. A minimum of a six-foot perimeter fencing is necessary to ensure the safety of your puppy. Until approximately nine months of age, we highly recommend that the pup is kept indoors at night and kept in a safe outdoor containment area during any unsupervised daytime hours.

Livestock Guardian Dogs will bark to alert you to danger and deter predators and other perceived threats. This barking may seem excessive to you and/or your neighbors. This natural trait could lead to potential issues for you, your neighbors, and even other members of your household. Livestock Guardian Dogs are known escape artists and prone to wandering. You may believe that you have them securely contained only to receive a phone call from an irritated neighbor. How do you intend to reinforce your Kangal's space to minimize escapes?			
Livestock Guardian puppies are prone to a puppy phase between approximately 12 24 weeks. Some of the behavior they may exhibit at this time includes intense chewing, destruction of your personal property (shoes, walls, baseboards, windowsills, doors, clothing, etc.), stubbornness, ignoring you and your commands, chasing livestock, and/or wrestling and roughhousing with other household pets. What will you do to correct your puppy and help them through this transitional phase?

start as early as ten months and last up to approximately 18 months of age. During
